

- June 28 Emergency Rules:
 - Clarified requirements of seed-tosale contract
 - Required foreign interest attestation
 - Implemented HB 2272

- November 1 Emergency Rules:
 - Implement HB 2646
 - Highlights:
 - Cease & desist ability for emergency situations
 - Stricter regulation on bad actors
 - Removes 24-hour notice requirement for inspections
 - More stringent lab testing requirements
