# Workplace Drones and Employment Issues



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## Drone Operation Laws – "Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (UAS)

- Federal
  - If laws conflict, federal laws take precedent over state drone laws
  - Flown for work/business purpose: pass FAA's *Aeronautical Knowledge Test* and follow FAA Part 107 regs (includes registration of drone, airspace, altitude and line-of-sight operation requirements)
  - Recreational use of drone: pass FAA's Recreational UAS Safety Test and follow FAA *Recreational Model Aircraft Rules*



## Drone Operation Laws – "Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (UAS)

#### Oklahoma

- Prohibited from flying within 400 feet of any "critical infrastructure facility"
- Prohibition does not apply to the owner or operator of the critical infrastructure facility (or obtains consent form the owner or operator)
- Examples: refinery, power generating, substation, natural gas compressor, gas or fuel terminal, wireless telecommunications, television/radio transmission, steelmaking, dams





# **Employers' Uses of Drones**

- Cameras with live feeds and recording capabilities
- Increase access to activities and locations (multiple)
- 24/7 or oncommand features





#### Employers' Uses of Drones (cont'd)

- Information gathering augments traditional video surveillance and other forms of security
  - Monitoring employee performance or presence (tasks completed, hours worked, etc.)
  - Investigating unauthorized use, access or damage to employer's property
  - Suspected theft of property and/or trade secrets





# **A Drone Policy for the Workplace**

- Prohibit unauthorized drones on employer's premises
   a) Define "premises" broadly and to include airspace
   b) Require specific notice and approval by employer
- 2. Do not monitor areas where employees have a "reasonable expectation of privacy"
- Notice to employees and guests of drone surveillance and recording – acknowledgement signed by employees
- 4. Unionized employers workplace surveillance = mandatory subject of bargaining?
