Madeline Dillner is the Brownfield Program Project Coordinator at the Oklahoma Corporation Commission. She started off her career at the OCC as a GIS intern georeferencing historical aerial photographs. Today, she manages dozens of brownfield projects at historic gas stations and oilfield sites undergoing assessment through the Brownfield Program's newest grants: a \$2,000,000 EPA Community-Wide Assessment Grant for States and Tribes, and a \$300,000 EPA Community-Wide Assessment Grant.

Having grown up in a small town (Winnebago, IL) and being a current resident of one (Wynnewood, OK), there is a special place in her heart for small-scale redevelopment that spurs community-wide revitalization.

Her special interests include grant writing, creative placemaking, and GIS. Dillner currently holds the position of Oklahoma Representative on the South Central Arc Users Group board (www.scaug.org) and has given several talks on using ArcGIS Online tools (particularly StoryMaps) to strengthen relationships with stakeholders and the public during community projects.
